- ▶ Effects of genre?
- ▶ Relationship between different EME plays based on 50 most common bigrams

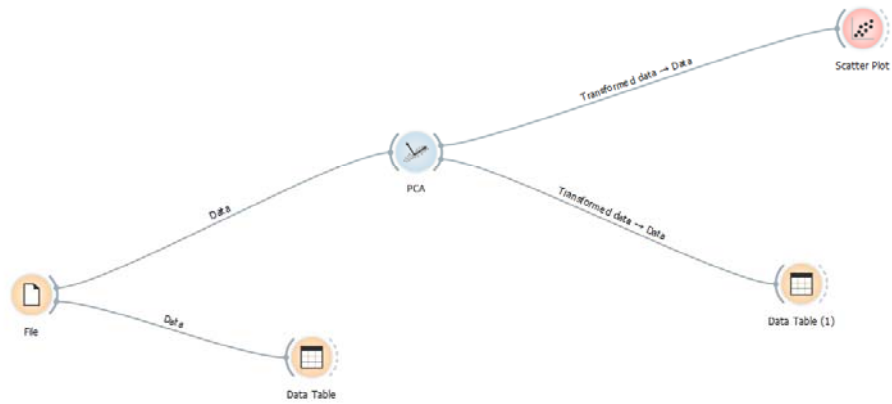
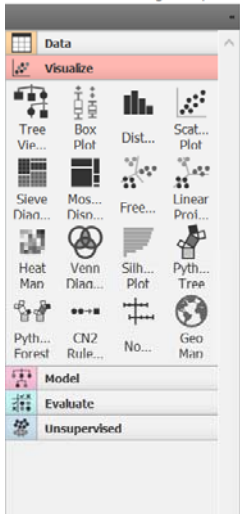
Method (1)

- ▶ Unsupervised method
 - ▶ Considered training texts
 - ▶ Time restraint
 - ▶ Principal Component Analysis (PCA) based on top 50 frequent Bigrams
- ▶ Corpus build
 - ▶ Size?
 - ▶ Visualizing English Print (VEP), Expanded Drama 1660 (1,292 texts)
 - ▶ English Verse Drama (556 texts)
 - ▶ Texts?
 - ▶ All of EME drama?
 - ▶ Professional plays?
 - ▶ Issues!

Method (2)

- ▶ Very experimental!
 - ▶ Use of R
 - ▶ Coding and software issues
 - ▶ Use of AntConc
 - ▶ Too much data
 - ▶ Use of LancsBox
 - ▶ Lack of N-Grams?
 - ▶ Use of Orange3
 - ▶ Easy to use!

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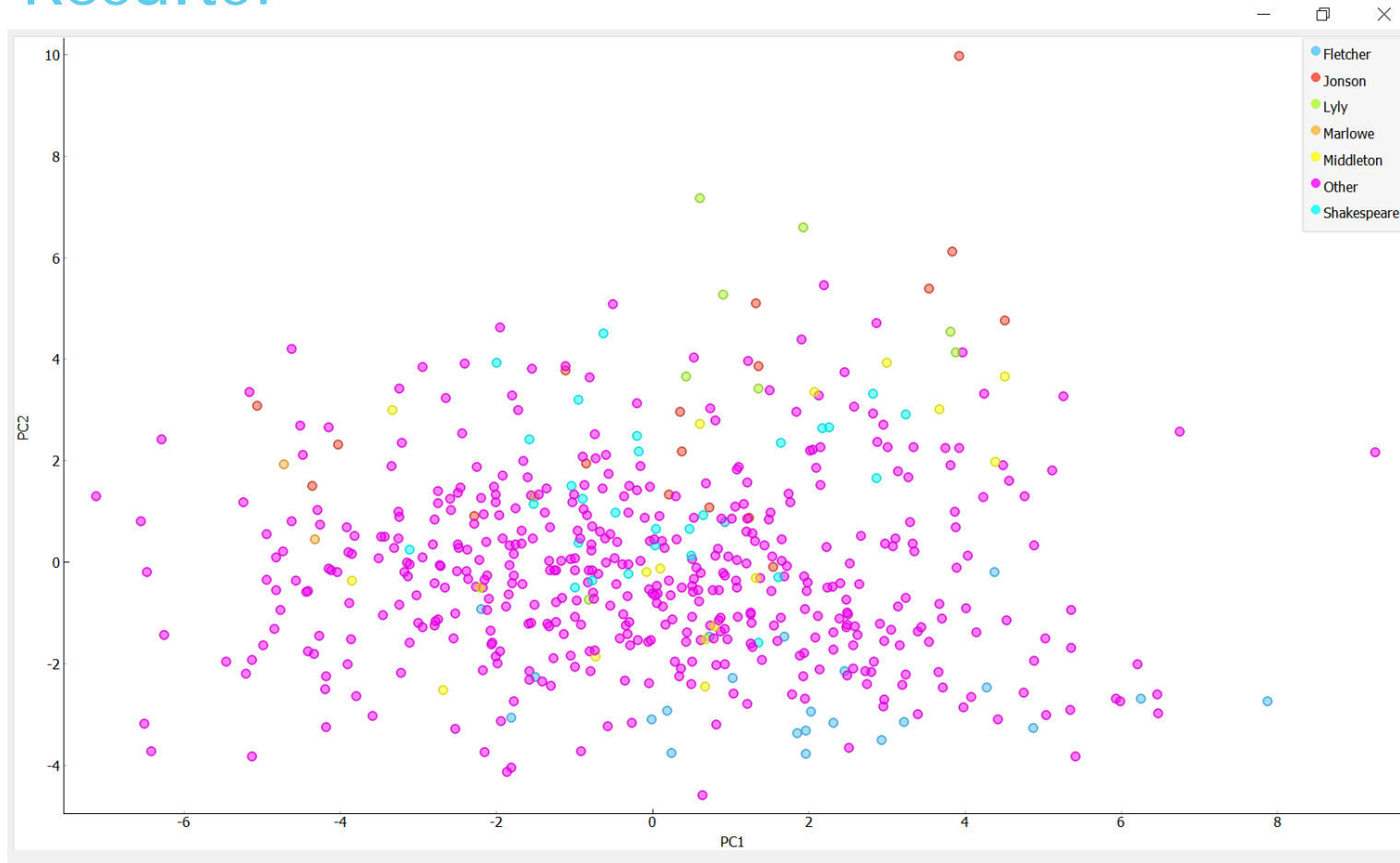


▶ Work flow in Orange 3

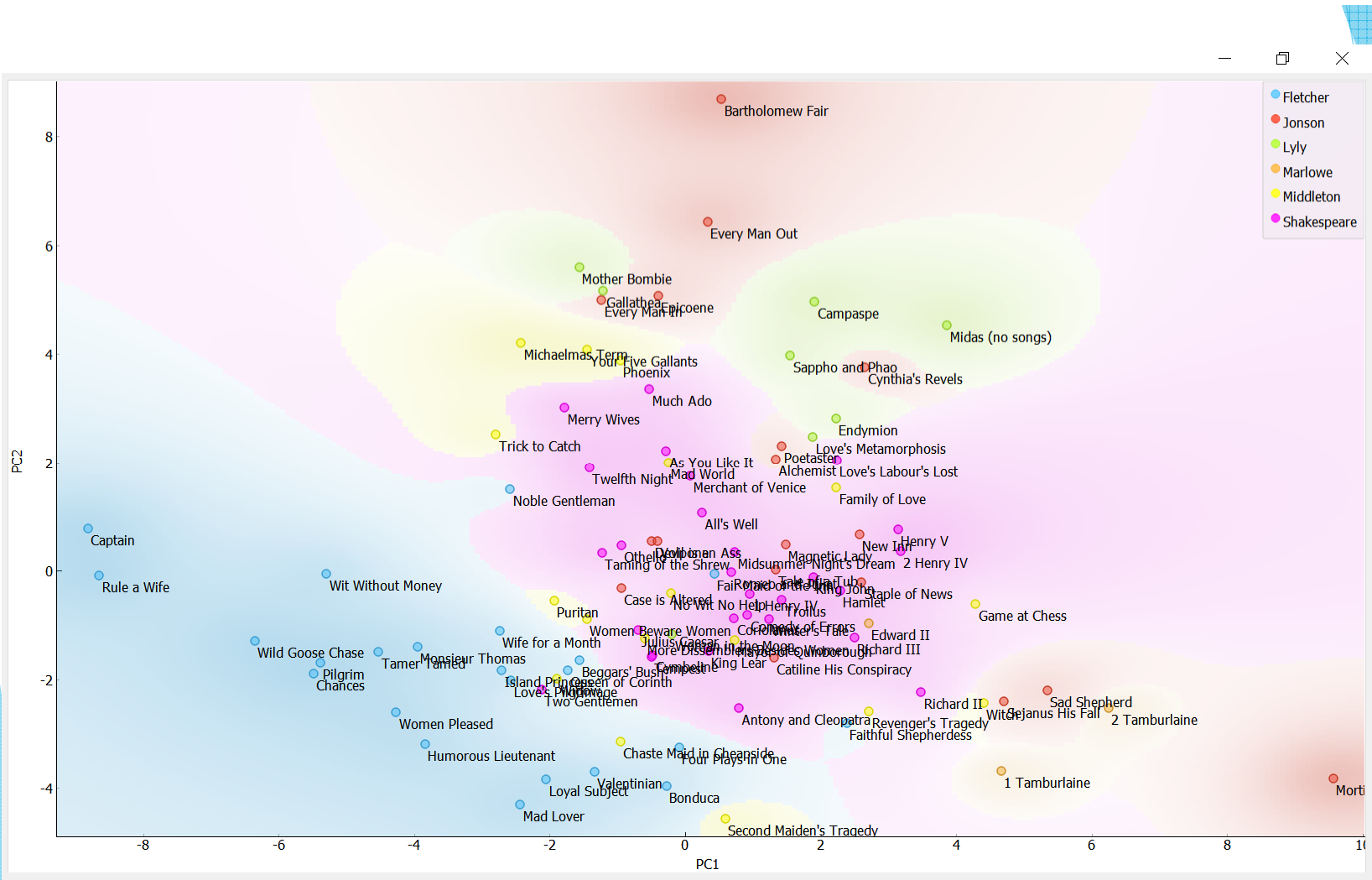

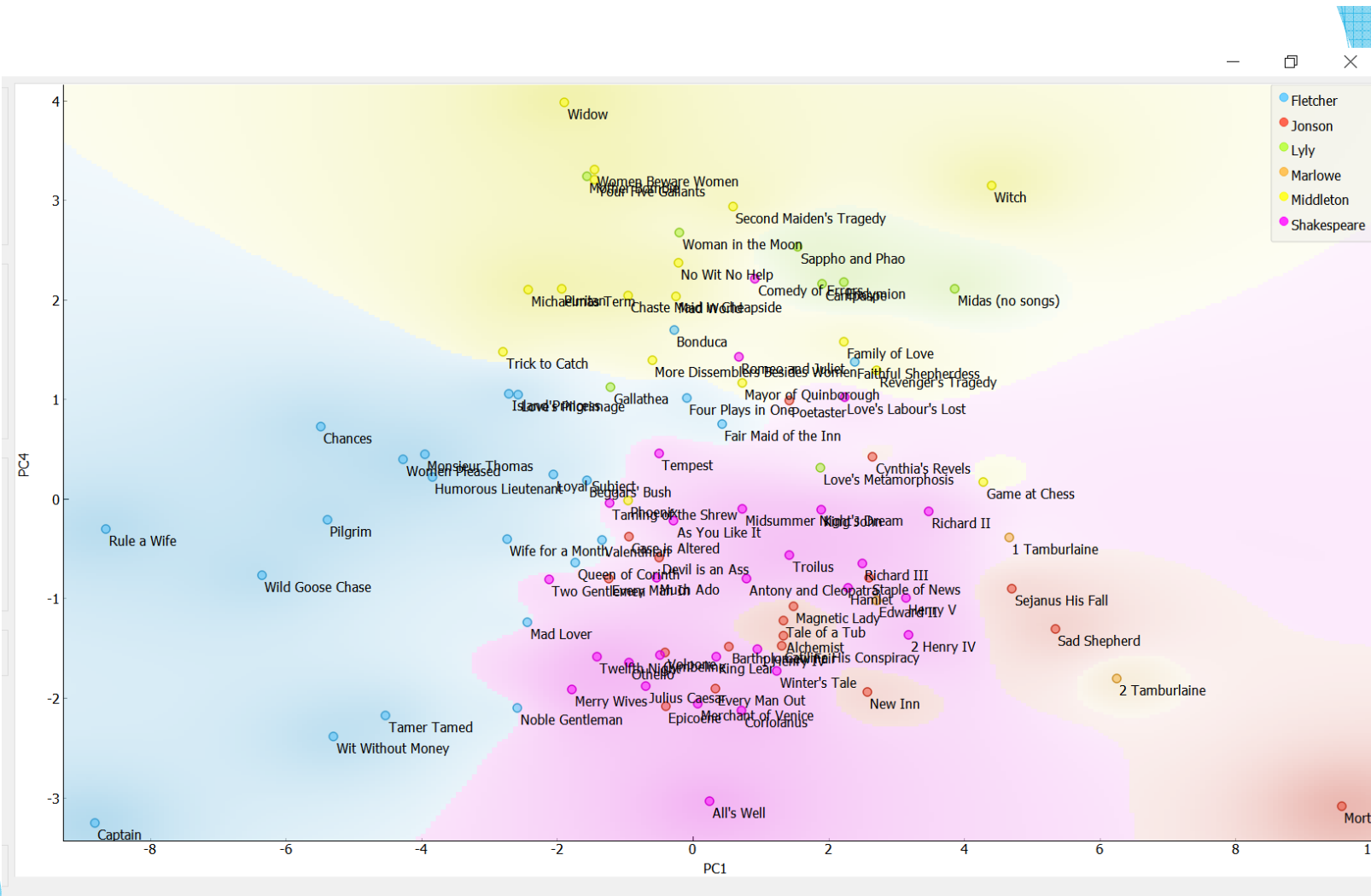
Results:



▶ All EME plays in the corpus plotted using PC1 and PC2



► Sole authorship plotted using PC1 and PC2



► Sole-authored plays plotted using PC1 and PC4

Conclusions:
